



Mr. Samuel Tommy Jackson

December 2, 1938 - September 1, 2017

On September 1, 2017 surrounded by his loving wife Sara and his beloved children, Chief Tommy Jackson, 78 of Ranburne, Alabama hung up his turnout gear, his coat and helmet, for the very last time and walked the path to heaven. To quote one beautiful tribute "he entered those pearly gates as he entered every door, with that big infectious smile". Heaven gained a good and faithful servant but our community lost a valued and treasured member.

In addition to his parents he is preceded in death by his sisters, Josephine C. Johnson Fletcher, Martha Jackson Isaacs, Jayne Toney and his brother John W. "Johnny" Jackson. He is survived by six siblings Beatrice Brown, Louise Bradley, James (Louise) Jackson, Rachel Jackson, Jesse (Betty) Jackson and Howard (Sharon) Jackson; his wife, Sara Jackson, his daughter Lisa Jackson Buchanan and her husband Dalton of Troy, Alabama, his sons, Jeff Jackson and his wife Lisa of Sarasota, Florida and Lance Jackson of Atlanta, Georgia; his seven grandchildren, Stephanie Hartley, Chanler Jackson, McKenna Jackson, Maddie Jackson, Thomas Jackson, Josh Buchanan and Amanda Bennett; and his four great grandchildren, Jackson Hartley, Samuel Hartley, Beau Hartley (due 10/17), Dallis Bennett.

Samuel Thomas "Tommy" Jackson was born December 2, 1938 in Carroll County, Georgia to the late Cliff Jackson and Alice V. Ayers Johnson Jackson. He started his life in a cabin off a dirt road in southwest Bowdon, Georgia born sixth of eleven children to a sharecropper. As sharecroppers, the Jacksons were a simple hard working family living on the farms they worked without ever owning their own home. The entire family, regardless of age or gender, performed back-breaking labor including plowing, commonly with a mule, planting, weeding, cutting wood for fire, clearing land and harvesting. Although Tommy Jackson and his siblings attended school, it was regularly interrupted when there was work to be done, especially during harvest time. There were no sports or after school activities. Tommy Jackson's early life taught him the value of commitment and hard work which served him well in every aspect of his life.

Tommy Jackson was a treasured member of his community. As the first Carroll County Fire Chief, he founded the highly successful fire department still in place today. He began his firefighting career in 1961 with the Bowdon Volunteer Fire Department at a time when the county was only served by volunteer firefighters and a few city departments. In 1969 he became the fire chief of Bowdon and in 1979 along with Carroll County Commissioner Horrie Duncan he founded the first countywide fire department becoming its first Chief. As part of his celebrated 22 year career he oversaw the building and renovation of 11 fire stations, led the hiring and training of personnel, purchased fire engines, organized the underwater rescue team and was part of the founding team of the emergency radio communications system, also known as 911. He remained chief until 1992 and finished his career in Bowdon where it all began. Gary L. Thomas summed it up beautifully when he shared "Chief Jackson was the right person at the right time to build a brand new fire department. Everything a department is able to do is based on the strength of the foundation of that department and Chief Jackson built a solid professional foundation".

He retired in 2001 and returned to his farming roots raising cattle on a family farm in Ranburne, Alabama with his wife Sara. An avid Rook player he played in a league twice a week but his first passion was his family. His dedication to Christ was known by all. His granddaughter McKenna shared who he was as a family man perfectly. "You were everything to me. You were my example, my hero and my best friend. You were the greatest man that I have ever known. You loved unconditionally, extended grace without hesitation, smiled constantly, and chased after Christ with all you had. You saved and changed so many lives. Your laugh, your smile, and the way you fiercely loved me more than anyone, will forever be etched on my heart. The legacy that you left on this world is unbelievable."

Acting as best friend to his grandchildren quite possibly may have been his most favorite role. Each family member has their story to tell and each one is more beautiful than the last. His first grandchild, Stephanie Hartley, has the most memories, calling him her first best friend. "My Granddaddy was the most amazing person I have ever had the honor and pleasure of knowing. He was the heart of our family, my saving grace, my superhero. He was the one who rocked me til my feet dragged the ground, singing 'She'll Be Coming Right The Mountain'. He was my superhero who checked me out of school anytime there was severe weather because he knew I was terrified. I was his sidekick who literally went everywhere with him, known to many as Tommy's little blonde headed girl. Growing up my Granddaddy was someone everyone loved talking to and always wanted to be around. In the small town where we lived, everyone knew Tommy and knew they could rely on him for any reason. His love for the Lord was vast and immovable, always having his bible by his side. He strongly influenced my love and faith in Jesus! I can only imagine the great

joy when Jesus experiences that big Tommy smile for the first time as he walks into the grace of the Lord! I will miss him greatly but I know this isn't goodbye forever."

"Chief" as he was known to many, Tommy Jackson was beloved by all. To his family he was a strong, hardworking, loyal and loving man. To his friends he was a dedicated leader and a hero and to many he was a "mentor before we even knew what that was". Tim Padgett's Facebook page included this lovely tribute. "He was not only our Chief ... he was a mentor, a hero and most of all ... he was a friend."

Holly Shadrix Jiles started working for Chief Jackson as a teenager after school serving as his administrative assistant. Her words and the impact he made on her life can be echoed by many. In their 33 years of friendship he was so much more than a boss or a friend, he was a second father. From the moment they met in 1984 when she was just 16 she says she knew immediately he was a man of respect, dignity, values and morals. "Everyone has heard the saying, everything you need to know you learned in kindergarten. Well for me, Tommy Jackson was my teacher. Many times over the years I have shared that he taught me to drive fast, taught me to always have a strong work ethic, show your respects, led by example and where to find the best BBQ. My most vivid memory of Tommy was always getting into his car and his bible being in the front seat beside him. I wanted to marry a man with that kind of faith."

As a man dedicated to the Lord, his family, his work and his community Carroll County will feel a huge loss from his passing. His life was dedicated to hard work, quality time he made for everyone and a legacy that will live on with his family.
