Mr. William "Bill" Gay, of Ranburne, Alabama, passed away on Wednesday, February 8, 2012. He was 88.

Mr. Gay was born on January 28, 1924 in Addison, Alabama to the late John Gilbert and Alice Lee Gay. He was a U.S. Army veteran of World War II having served in northern France. He received the Purple Heart Medal for his wounds in combat and also received eight other military accommodations. After the war, he returned to the U.S. and began a long career as a brick Mason. He was a member of Indian Creek Baptist Church.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brothers and sisters, John Gilbert Gay, Otis Gay, Tom Gay, Inez Warren, Gale Freeman, Ruby Rucks, Martha Gaines, Kate Carroll, Nannice Gaines, and Elizabeth Birdsong.

He is survived by his wife, Mary Roberts Gay; his son, Fred Gay; his daughter, Willene Isbell; and his grandchildren, Wade Gay and Jessica Gay.
