Corine Warren Adams, Mawmaw Corine, to those who knew and loved her, passed away on Friday, March 19, 2021 at 98 years old. Corine made sure that she passed down her cooking skills to many of her children and grandchildren.

Mawmaw Corine loved a good yard sale and collected many treasures to share with her family and friends. She insisted that anyone who visited her was sure to take home some trinket, fruit, nuts, flowers, or canned goods as you could not leave her house empty handed. Mawmaw taught us all an appreciation and love for flowers, birds, rocks, gardening, and all of nature. Many a time, she could be seen leading a group of unruly grandkids on a walk through the woods down to the creek to play. She enjoyed working in her flower garden and picked many bouquets for those she loved. She added beauty to the world by sharing her love of flowers with everyone that knew her.

Corine lived her life exemplifying Christian values and was saved at an early age. She was the oldest living member of Kansas Baptist Church. She had a multi-generational impact on not only her family, but her friends and the community as well; she will forever be loved and cherished. To her family, there was nothing she couldn't accomplish. She was truly an inspiration and role model for generations to come.

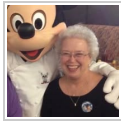
