



## Mrs. Frances Causey Harrison

February 24, 1914 - August 23, 2010

Mrs. Alice Frances Causey Harrison was born in 1914, in the Victory community near Bowdon, Georgia. She was the daughter of Ada Bartlett Causey and Eugene Ambrose Causey and was named for her grandmothers Alice Bartlett and Martha Frances Causey. She was the great grand-daughter of George McDaniel of the McDaniel brothers that moved to the Bowdon community in 1848, before the town was founded.

She joined Victory Methodist Church, where her grandfather, William Ambrose Causey, had been the first pastor, at an early age and later became affiliated with Bowdon Methodist Church, where she taught Sunday School after the family moved to Bowdon.

She attended Farmer's High School and then the Bowdon Schools. She enrolled in Bowdon College and later transferred to Georgia State College for Women in Milledgeville. She was a teacher for the Carroll County School System, having been the first (and first grade) teacher at Clem School.

Alice Frances Causey married Curtis Hamilton Harrison on December 26, 1936. After living in Anniston, Alabama, during the World War II years, they returned to Bowdon where they were active in life of the community and their church. They owned and operated Digby-Harrison Furniture until their retirement. Frances was a member of the Stitch and Chat Sewing Club.

A talented musician, for many years she was pianist and then organist at Bowdon Methodist. She also provided private piano lessons for more than a decade to students at Bowdon Elementary and in her home.

On May 23, 1990, Curtis Harrison passed away after a battle with cancer. Frances remained in the home they had built on the corner of East College and Frances Streets for 11 more years and continued to be involved in church and other groups.

On Mother's Day 2001, she began sharing her time with her daughter and her son-in-law, Miriam and Ron, in Macon and with her son and daughter-in-law, Dan and Stephanie, in Englewood, Fl, coming back home to Bowdon from time to time.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, and her siblings, Fred and Claude Causey, and Jean Hawkes.

She is survived by her son Dan, his wife, Stephanie, and their children, Lee Harrison of Tampa, Fl. and Whitney Schiffer (Charlie) of Miami, Fl., and her daughter Miriam and her husband, Ron Langley, of Macon, Ga and their children, Reid (Stephanie) Langley of Bethel, Ga., and Meredith, Matthew and Patrick (Tasha) Langley all of Macon, Ga, and great grand children, Ethan and Lawson Langley, and Brittany and Chelsea Schiffer.

She is also survived by her sisters, Dorothy Causey Copeland of Birmingham, Al. and Carolyn Causey Suder of Atlanta, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Services for Mrs. Frances Harrison will be held at Rainwater Funeral Home on Thursday, August 26, 2010 at 11:00 a.m. with Pastor Cindy Conner officiating.

Music will be provided by Walter Shealy. The eulogy will be given by Judy Rowell. Interment will follow in the Bowdon First United Methodist Church cemetery.
