A beloved mother, daughter, sister, and friend, Jayme was deeply committed

Her quick wit, and talent for getting straight to the heart of the matter, was fondly appreciated by her family and friends. She was quick to laugh, slow to anger, and generous in grace. She was set in her ways, and there was no changing that.
