Mrs. Sarah Cunningham, of Moreland, Georgia, passed away on October 14, 2025. She was 97.

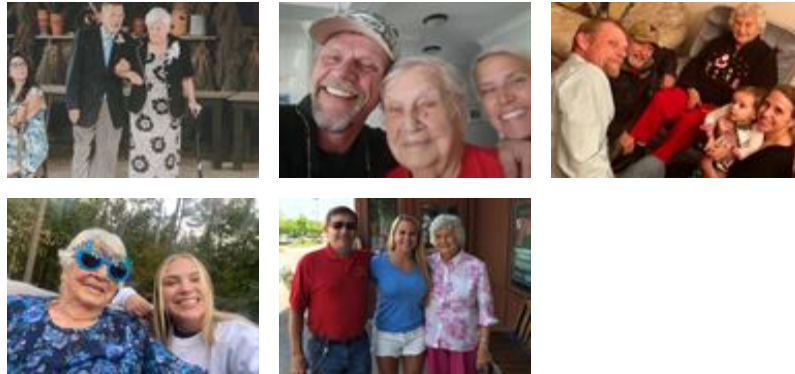
